The immense response to the program spiraled into a very successful public relations program that continually grows stronger.

The concept was soon adopted in the U.S.A. In 1985 the Orlando, Florida Police Department was the first in the United States to initiate a Citizens' Police Academy. The goal of reducing crime through public commitment and informing citizens about Police Department functions was a huge success. Within the same year Missouri City and Texas implemented a similar curriculum.
