Petitions for the Consolidated Election began circulating on August 20th and can be pickup in the Village Clerk's Office location at the Village Hall, 5600 Hunter Drive during regular office hours of Monday-Friday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. The following positions are up for election:

- (3) Village Trustee (4-Year Full Term)
- (1) Village Trustee (2-Year Unexpired Term)
- (1) Village President (4-Year Full Term)

Nominating petitions need to be filed during the week of November 12-18, 2024 in the Village Clerk's Office between regular office hours stated above, except on November 18th the Clerk's Office will be open until 5 p.m. If a lottery is required to take place, it will be held on November 22nd at 10 a.m. in the Village Hall Board room. The last day to file an objection to nominating petitions is November 25th.
