As we turn the corner toward spring, yes, it's almost here! I'm reminded how much there is to feel proud of in Richmond. Each season brings new opportunities, and our focus remains the same: planning thoughtfully for the future while preserving the character and heart of our community.

One of our biggest areas of focus lately has been smart, intentional growth. As available land becomes more limited, we're taking a more careful approach to what we allow, where it goes, and how it fits into the fabric of Richmond. Recently, we rezoned a piece of property from business to a brand-new residential classification for our community: townhouses. This gives us more housing options while still maintaining the look and feel we value, not just filling space, but shaping it with purpose.

Road improvements are always top of mind, and we're stepping up our efforts in a big way. Commercial Street is next on the list for resurfacing, and it's part of a broader plan to improve roads throughout the Village. Thanks to the 1% sales tax that was passed, Richmond will receive additional dollars that are being invested directly into infrastructure and quality-of-life improvements that benefit everyone.

Supporting our local businesses continues to be a major priority. We recently launched a new Business Hub on the Village website. A one-stop FAQ resource designed to make it easier for business owners to find answers without jumping through hoops. We also passed a Façade and ADA Improvement Program, offering a matching grant of up to \$10,000 for exterior upgrades or ADA-friendly improvements. Our message is simple: we stand behind our local businesses and want them to succeed.

Facade improvements help keep Richmond a desirable place to visit and live in, attracts new customers to mom-and-pop shops that need the traffic now more than ever, and increases property values. Additionally, retrofitting existing sidewalks and entrances with ramps or other barrier-free improvements makes Richmond a more friendly place for our aging neighbors and those with disabilities.

And while we're thinking ahead, don't forget to keep an eye on Stevens Park in March. We'll be adding a festive little touch to celebrate St. Patrick's Day and hosting our annual St. Patrick's Day event downtown on March 7th at The District. It's just one small way to keep our community fun, welcoming, and full of spirit.

Thank you for being part of what makes Richmond such a special place. With spring right around the corner, there's a lot to look forward to, and we're excited about what's ahead.
